NOTICE

BY-LAW CHANGES

The power to alter, amend, or repeal the code of by-laws, or adopting a new code of by-laws to the South Dakota Lions Eye Bank, is vested in the general membership of the Lions Clubs of South Dakota. The below bylaw changes were presented to, voted upon, and a motion was passed by majority of the general membership of Lions Clubs of South Dakota at the 2010 Lions State Convention on January 30, 2010.

Article V Directors

Section 1

The business and property of the corporation shall be managed and controlled by the Board of Directors. At all times, fifty-one percent (51%) of the Board of Directors shall be active members of a South Dakota Lions Club. The number of voting members of the board of this corporation shall not be fewer than eleven (11), with no upper limit. The number of directors may be increased or decreased by amendments to the By-laws, provided, however, no decrease shall have the effect of shortening the term of any incumbent director.

Section 2

The term of each elected director shall be three (3) years. Terms shall be staggered so that at least two directors are elected annually (at least one from each Lions district in South Dakota). Initial terms of the directors are as follows:

There shall be four (4) elected members who are members of Lions and Lioness clubs in good standing in District 5SE.

There shall be four (4) elected members who are members of Lions and Lioness clubs in good standing in District 5SW. There shall be three (3) additional members selected to the South Dakota Lions Eye Bank, Inc. Medical Advisory Committee. These members may be non-Lions. An effort will be made to fill these positions with members from the following organizations:

- South Dakota Academy of Ophthalmology
- South Dakota Nurses Association
- South Dakota State Legislature
- State Medical Association
- South Dakota State Hospital Association
- South Dakota Physicians Association
- South Dakota Morticians Association

The selected members will normally serve for a maximum of three (3) years and must have Board of Directors approval. Should any of the three selected members choose to serve another three (3) years or any part of, they must have unanimous approval of the Board of Directors. The two selected members will have voting privileges.

There shall be six (6) non-voting ex-officio members, approved by Board action, who shall serve one-year terms and whose positions shall be entitled: 1. Medical Director; 2. Executive Director; 3. Research Director; 4. Past Board Chair of the South Dakota Lions Foundation; 5. Second Vice District Governor of District 5SE, and 6. Second Vice District Governor of District 5SW.

Section 7

Regular or special meetings may be held within or without the State of South Dakota as the Board of Directors may determine. Members of the Board may participate in meetings in person or by conference telephone or similar communications equipment so that all participants can be heard. Not fewer than six (6) members of the Board shall constitute a quorum to conduct business at any regular or special meeting. In addition, for business to be conducted a majority of the members present must be Lion or Lioness members before any meeting can be called to order. In order for a meeting to be held, each member of the Board of Directors, including the ex-officio members, must be notified in writing or by email or facsimile transmission at least five (5) days prior to the meeting date unless such notice is waived by the director. Whenever any notice is required to be given under the provisions of the South Dakota Nonprofit Corporation Act, the Articles of Incorporation or the By-laws of the Corporation, a waiver of such notice in writing signed by the person or persons entitled to such notice, whether before or after the time stated in the same, shall be deemed equivalent to the giving of such notice.

BUILDING BRIDGES OF INTERNATIONAL UNDERSTANDING/COOPERATION

Lions have big hearts, broad vision, and boundless energy and when these characteristics are utilized to their fullest potential great things happen. These are some of the programs and activities that will promote international understanding and cooperation.

I would like to encourage clubs to:

- * Provide assistance to Haiti's relief efforts by conducting a fundraising event soon
- * Continue to collect eye glasses, in 2009 38,000 eye glasses from SD were distributed to people in other countries - can we even increase that number this year?
- * Support Lions International Youth Exchange and Youth Camps. Our youth are our future Lions and leaders
- * Attend Lions International Conventions which offer a wonderful opportunity to obtain an understanding of people from other countries
- * Participate in the Lions Peace Poster Contest

Let's make it a high priority this year to build bridges of understanding and cooperation among our brothers and sisters around the world.

Life expectancy:	Haiti 59.6 years	US 78 years
Infant mortality:	Haiti 59.6/1000	US 6.7/1000
Literacy:	Haiti 61%	US 99%
Population	Haiti 9,000,000	US 300,000,000
Projected earthquake fatalities:	Haiti 200,000	US equivalent 6,000,000

I am asking every Lions club in 5-SW to conduct a fundraising activity during March 13-21. It will be up to your club to decide what type of activity will best suit your community. If your club is unable to mobilize for this event, please consider a generous donation to this worthy cause.

I believe that as your District Governor it is my duty and my calling to guide and lead the Lions of 5-SW into action to assist the beleaguered people of Haiti. We, the citizens of the wealthiest nation on earth and the members of the world's largest, most efficient service organization are uniquely qualified to assist the poorest nation on this side of the globe. Great challenges provide great opportunities—and this opportunity, albeit a tragic one is TO SERVE—that's who we are, and that's what we do.

I know I am asking a great deal from all of you and it will take a lot of effort and some inconvenience to see this project through, however any inconvenience we experience is miniscule compared to the suffering and harsh conditions that exist for our neighbors in the Caribbean. Letters and e-mails will soon be sent every club president and secretary providing more detailed information regarding this endeavor. So I am very happy to announce that the Britton and Eden Lions Clubs have stepped up to the plate to host the 2010 Fall Forum at Ft Sisseton. Lucky enough, Britton and Eden are in Zone 1. The Britton Lions showed up to promote their site in traditional dress from the late 1800's and also won the furthest traveled award.

The Hall of Fame dinner is the highlight of the convention and this year we had two Lions from District 5SE go into the Hall of Fame and they were PDG Don Selberg from the Sioux Falls Siouxrise Club and Perry Pollard from the Sioux Falls Downtown Club. I am glad I am District Governor and was able to take part in the inducting of these two great Lions for their years of volunteerism in Lions.

LCIF DEVELOPMENT PLAN IS ON THE MOVE

In October I announced the new LCIF fundraising initiative called the LCIF DEVELOPMENT PLAN. It is a new system for raising funds for our international foundation with a goal of increasing world-wide foundation giving from the current \$20 million to \$30 million by 2012. The new system is patterned after the hugely successful Campaign SightFirst II program which ended in 2008 and raised over \$200 million in just three years.

The goal for our LCIF sector (North and South Dakota) is to be 100%. In other words, we want to have every club in the sector be a contributor to LCIF. Right now well below 50% of North and South Dakota clubs contribute to LCIF.

Last fall, the LCIF DEVELOPMENT PLAN District Coordinators for the five Dakota districts sent letters with brochures to all clubs in the sector. The intent of the letter was to explain the new system and to ask clubs to make plans to participate. Several clubs have responded but we have a long way to go to achieve 100%.

Another letter from the District Coordinators will be sent to all clubs in January. This mailing will include additional information about the new LCIF DEVELOPMENT PLAN along with another brochure designed to answer questions about the program. Club presidents are asked to be on the lookout for this mailing and to have their club take action by sending their contribution to their respective District Coordinators.

LCIF DEVELOPMENT PLAN District Coordinators for our sector are Cindy Iversen (SSE), Ken Gifford (SSW), Robert Littlefield (SNE), Dan Vondrachek (SNC) and Dave Czywczynski (SNW). Please contact your District Coordinators or me if you have questions.

Lions Clubs International always has at least one major initiative in the works. At this time, that major initiative is the LCI DEVELOPMENT PLAN. I encourage all clubs in North and South Dakota to hop on board and help make our sector 100%.

A roll call or secret ballot vote may be directed by the Chairperson if considered warranted, or may be requested by a motion passed by a majority of qualified delegates present. The Credentials Committee shall conduct all written ballot voting. After the votes have been counted, said ballots shall be turned over to the Secretary to destroy. Voting shall be based on one (1) vote for each ten (10) members of a club or a major fraction. Five (5) members shall constitute a major fraction.
15. Solicitation or sale of club project items with the exception of the host club(s) is prohibited. The host club(s) shall secure permission from the Council of Governors.
16. Business Sessions shall be smoke free. Smoking areas shall be established outside of the business area and for all convention meals.
